been progressing; and the nuts and bolts of necessary planning are being locked into place following the formation of a Strategy Group. Ways of progressing the union are being discussed and the most interesting development is the possibility of having an Interim Minister to assist us.

A presentation on Interim Ministry has been made by Daran Golby the Ministry Development manager at 121 George Street. If agreed, we have the option of appointing an Interim Minister for twelve months from Spring 2023 to accompany and support the congregations, Interim Moderators and Kirk Sessions.

If the congregations decide to go down that route then one could soon be appointed because the central authorities have assured us that an Interim Minister is available. Previously, we had been led to believe that we would have been at the

back of the queue and so there was a reluctance to pursue that option.

In summary, the wheels are now turning a little faster and moving in the right direction. Like the changing of the seasons, advances are being made. So thank you for being patient during the months of seeming inactivity and may you look forward to the celebration of Easter, when we share the Good News of Resurrection and new life.

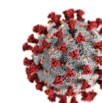

## Town Centre Churches - Update

On 1<sup>st</sup> March, the Kirk Sessions of the four Town Centre churches attended, a presentation on Interim Ministry by Daran Golby (Ministries Development Manager) and Sandra Black (Interim Minister). Representatives from Fife Presbytery were also in attendance.

The presentation outlined why an Interim Minister might be appointed, and through discussions with the four churches, what their role would be in helping us all to move forward and what shape Team Ministry in Kirkcaldy Town Centre could look like.

St Bryce Kirk Session has agreed that appointing an Interim Minister is the best way in moving towards a union of the four Town Centre Churches.

The other three Kirk Sessions have also agreed.

On Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> April, all four congregations, after their morning services, will be given the opportunity to hear (the same) information on Interim ministry.
